New Employee Orientation - Why Bother?

In the fourth quarter of 2022, ESI rolled out a program to offer an orientation program for new hires of ESI clients. The program has been offered at least once every month for six months now with positive feedback from those who have attended. Nearly 60 people have attended the event, some new and others having been at the IFMC for many years.

Some comments heard from participants include:

- "This event was so helpful in giving me the big picture."
- "I learned more about the IFMC at this event than I did my entire six years here."
- "This should be required for new hires."

This orientation program was developed as a piece of the effort to increase retention rates. Research shows that an effective and robust on-boarding process leads to a more positive initial experience for new hires, therefore leading to a higher likelihood of that employee remaining part of that team.

The orientation program also helps increase retention rates by helping employees understand the big picture of what they are involved in. Again, research shows that employees are happier when they see the part their work plays in achieving the bigger picture.

The orientation program offers value but it is just one piece of the picture to creating a place where people want to work. Other efforts are in the works and will be shared as they become available.

Six Additional AED's Have Been Acquired!

In April, 2022, we shared with you ESI's goal to have an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in every building. ESI is one step closer to that goal!

An AED is a device used in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest. The portable device is used to analyze the heart's rhythm, and, if needed, can deliver defibrillation to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

Through participation in safety trainings and quizzes, Leslie Davis from ESI earned enough points to acquire six new AEDs.

These will be distributed to businesses within the IFCM that don't already have an AED, focusing on facilities furthest from emergency health care first. Once these six are distributed, all outlying businesses in the IFMC will have one and within the next year, every facility will have one.

Your Health Matters A message from USI, ESI's health insurance broker.



Did you know that someone in the U.S. dies from a stroke every three and a half minutes, and that stroke is a leading cause of disability? A stroke is when blood flow to the brain is blocked, which can lead to severe brain damage or even death.

Think FAST when stroke signs and symptoms occur:

- Face drooping or numbness on one side is a very common first sign of stroke. Ask the person to smile
 and if they have difficulty doing so, especially on one side, they may be experiencing a stroke.
- Arm weakness is another common sign of stroke. Ask the person to raise both arms. Do you notice one arm drifting downward?
- Speech difficulty is the next symptom to look for. Is the person's speech slurred?
- Time. If the person is experiencing any of the above, call 911 immediately. Don't wait!

Other Signs of Stroke

These less-common symptoms tend to occur suddenly. You should also call 911 immediately if the person is experiencing any of these listed below. It's common for a person to experience multiple symptoms simultaneously.

- Numbness
- Confusion
- Difficulty seeing
- Difficulty walking
- Severe headache

Risk Factors for Stroke

Having one or more of the following risk factors can increase your risk for stroke. Speak with your physician about your risk for stroke if any of the below apply to you.

- High blood pressure
- Smoking
- Diabetes
- Obesity
- Physical inactivity
- High cholesterol
- Heart disease
- Atrial fibrillation
- Peripheral artery disease
- Sickle cell anemia

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
